About Our Worship: We use an Anglican liturgy. Liturgy simply means that everyone gets to participate, so please join in as you feel comfortable.

Children's Worship: Nursery is available for children 6 months through 4 years. Children's Worship rooms are available for children Kindergarten through 2nd Grade, and 3rd to 5th Grade. You may choose to keep children with your family, and coloring pages will be available to all.

Assisted Listening or Noise Cancelling Headphones: Pick up a loop in the livestream booth (the door to the right of the fireplace in the Fireside Room). An usher can guide you there. Noise cancelling headphones are available at the info table for those who might be sensitive to noise.

Today we celebrate ordination and confirmation in our service. You'll notice that the liturgical color is red – red altar cloths, banners, and vestments – because both ordination and confirmation are occasions when we ask the Holy Spirit to be present in a special way in the lives of confirmands and ordinands. In confirmation, the confirmands reaffirm their faith and ask the Holy Spirit to continue to be present in their lives as they walk in the way of Jesus. In ordination, the ordinand makes promises to serve the church and asks the Holy Spirit for special assistance in that service. We pray for those being confirmed and ordained that they will be strengthened in their faith and blessed in their service to the local church.

ORDINATION OF SARAH RAE LINDSAY



Sarah Lindsay is the Pastor of Adult Formation at Church of the Savior. She has been on staff since 2018, and started discerning a call to ordained ministry soon after beginning to work at Savior. Before her time at Savior, Sarah earned a PhD in English and spent time teaching; she still enjoys being able to teach and learn as she serves in the church. Sarah is married to Brad, and they have three daughters: Isabel (14), Claire (12), and Vivian (10). She enjoys spending time with her family as well as baking, knitting, and reading. Sarah is very grateful for the love and support of the Savior community as she has followed God's leading towards ordination.

Presenters: Brian, Bishop in the Church of God, on behalf of the clergy and people of the Diocese of Churches for the Sake of Others, we present to you Sarah Rae Lindsay to be ordained a deacon in Christ's holy catholic Church.

Bishop: Has she been selected in accordance with the canons of this Church? And do you believe her manner of life to be suitable to the exercise of this ministry?

Presenters: We certify to you that she has satisfied the requirements of the canons, and we believe her to be qualified for this order.

The Bishop then requires the Ordinand to take the Oath of Conformity and the Oath of Canonical Obedience saying

Bishop: The Canons require that no one may be ordained a Deacon in the Church before subscribing without reservation to the Oath of Conformity. It is also required that each Ordinand subscribe without reservation to the Oath of Canonical Obedience. In the presence of this Congregation, I now charge you to make your solemn declaration of these oaths.

The Ordinand then declares

Ordinand: I, Sarah Rae Lindsay, do believe the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the Word of God and to contain all things necessary to salvation, and I consequently hold myself bound to conform my life and ministry thereto, and therefore I do solemnly engage to conform to the Doctrine, Discipline, and Worship of Christ as this Church has received them.

And I do promise, here in the presence of Almighty God and of the Church, that I will pay true and canonical obedience in all things lawful and honest to the Bishop of Churches for the Sake of Others, and his successors, so help me God.

The Ordinand then signs the Oath of Conformity and the Oath of Canonical Obedience in the sight of all present.

You may stand.

Bishop: Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, you know the importance of this ministry, and the weight of your responsibility in presenting this person for ordination to the sacred Order of Deacons. Therefore, if any of you know of any impediment or crime because of which we should not proceed, come forward now and make it known.

If no objection is made, the Bishop continues

Bishop: Is it your will that Sarah Rae Lindsay be ordained as Deacon?

All: It is.

Bishop: Will you uphold her in her ministry?

All: We will.

Bishop: In peace let us pray to the Lord.

Bishop: That it may please you to inspire all Bishops, Priests, and Deacons with the love of you and of your truth,

All: We beseech you to hear us, good Lord.

Bishop: That it may please you to endue all ministers of your Church with devotion to your glory and to the salvation of souls,

All: We beseech you to hear us, good Lord.

Bishop: That it may please you to bless this your servant, now to be admitted to the Order of Deacons, and to pour your grace upon her, that she may duly execute her office to the edification of your Church, and to the glory of your holy Name,

All: We beseech you to hear us, good Lord.

Bishop: That it may please you to guide by your indwelling Spirit those whom you call to the ministry of your Church; that they may go forward with courage, and persevere to the end,

All: We beseech you to hear us, good Lord.

Bishop: That it may please you to increase the number of ministers in your Church, that the Gospel may be preached to all people,

All: We beseech you to hear us, good Lord.

Bishop: That it may please you to grant us true repentance, amendment of life, and the forgiveness of all our sins,

All: We beseech you to hear us, good Lord.

Bishop: That it may please you to hasten the fulfillment of your purpose, that your Church may be one,

All: We beseech you to hear us, good Lord.

Bishop: That it may please you to grant that we, with all your saints, may be partakers of your everlasting kingdom,

All: We beseech you to hear us, good Lord.

Bishop: Lord, have mercy upon us.

All: Christ, have mercy upon us.

Bishop: Lord, have mercy upon us.

Bishop: Hear us, O Lord, when we cry out to you;

All: Have mercy upon us and hear us.

Bishop: O Lord, arise and help us;

All: And deliver us for your Name's sake.

Bishop: Let your priests be clothed with righteousness;

All: And let your saints sing with joy.

Bishop: O Lord, hear our prayer;

All: And let our cry come to you.

Bishop: The Lord be with you.

Almighty God, by your divine providence you appointed various Orders of Ministers in your Church, and you inspired your Apostles to appoint to the Order of Deacons the first martyr Stephen, with others: mercifully behold this your servant now called to the same office and administration; so fill her with the truth of your doctrine and adorn her with holiness of life, that by word and good example she may faithfully serve you in this office, to the glory of your Name and the edification of your Church; through the merits of our Savior Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, now and for ever. Amen.

THE FIRST LESSON

ACTS 3:12-19

¹² And when Peter saw it he addressed the people: “Men of Israel, why do you wonder at this, or why do you stare at us, as though by our own power or piety we have made him walk? ¹³ The God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, the God of our fathers, glorified his servant Jesus, whom you delivered over and denied in the presence of Pilate, when he had decided to release him. ¹⁴ But you denied the Holy and Righteous One, and asked for a murderer to be granted to you, ¹⁵ and you killed the Author of life, whom God raised from the dead. To this we are witnesses. ¹⁶ And his name—by faith in his name—has made this man strong whom you see and know, and the faith that is through Jesus has given the man this perfect health in the presence of you all.

¹⁷ “And now, brothers, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did also your rulers. ¹⁸ But what God foretold by the mouth of all the prophets, that his Christ would suffer, he thus fulfilled. ¹⁹ Repent therefore, and turn back, that your sins may be blotted out.

¹ See what kind of love the Father has given to us, that we should be called children of God; and so we are. The reason why the world does not know us is that it did not know him. ² Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is. ³ And everyone who thus hopes in him purifies himself as he is pure.

⁴ Everyone who makes a practice of sinning also practices lawlessness; sin is lawlessness. ⁵ You know that he appeared in order to take away sins, and in him there is no sin. ⁶ No one who abides in him keeps on sinning; no one who keeps on sinning has either seen him or known him. ⁷ Little children, let no one deceive you. Whoever practices righteousness is righteous, as he is righteous.

³⁶ As they were talking about these things, Jesus himself stood among them, and said to them, "Peace to you!" ³⁷ But they were startled and frightened and thought they saw a spirit. ³⁸ And he said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts arise in your hearts?" ³⁹ See my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me, and see. For a spirit does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have." ⁴⁰ And when he had said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. ⁴¹ And while they still disbelieved for joy and were marveling, he said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?" ⁴² They gave him a piece of broiled fish, ⁴³ and he took it and ate before them.

THE SERMON



The Story, the Rest and the Hope of God Bishop Brian Wallace

We take a few minutes of silence to reflect, pray, and listen for what God may be saying.

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The Psalm is taken from The Book of Common Prayer, public domain.

THE NICENE CREED

You may stand.

All: We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God,
begotten, not made,
of one Being with the Father.
Through him all things were made.
For us and for our salvation
he came down from heaven:
by the power of the Holy Spirit
he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary,
and was made man.
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;
he suffered death and was buried.
On the third day he rose again
in accordance with the Scriptures;
he ascended into heaven
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,
and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life,
who proceeds from the Father and the Son.
With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified.
He has spoken through the Prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead,

THE EXHORTATION

Please be seated.

Bishop: It belongs to the office of a Deacon to share in the humility and service of our Lord Jesus Christ, for the strengthening of the Church, which is his body. You are to read the Gospel and proclaim Christ at all times through your service, to instruct both young and old in the Catechism, and, at the direction of the Bishop or Priest, to baptize and preach.

You are to assist the Priest in public worship, to guide the intercessions of the Congregation, to aid in the administration of Holy Communion, and to carry the Sacrament to those who are kept from the Table by illness, infirmity, or imprisonment.

Furthermore, you are to interpret to the Church the needs, concerns, and hopes of the world. It is the Deacon's office to encourage and equip the household of God to care for the stranger, to embrace the poor and helpless, and to seek them out, so that they may be relieved.

THE EXAMINATION

Bishop: Will you take up this charge gladly and willingly?

Ordinand: I will, the Lord being my helper.

Bishop: Do you trust that you are inwardly moved by the Holy Spirit to take upon yourself this Office and ministry, to serve God for the promoting of his glory and the edifying of his people?

Ordinand: I do so trust.

Bishop: Do you believe that you are truly called, according to the will of our Lord Jesus Christ, and in accordance with the Canons of this Church, to this Office and ministry?

Ordinand: I do so believe.

Bishop: Are you persuaded that the Holy Scriptures contain all things necessary for salvation through faith in Jesus Christ?

Ordinand: I am so persuaded.

Bishop: Will you diligently read these Scriptures to the people assembled in the church where you are appointed to serve?

Ordinand: I will.

Bishop: Will you be diligent to frame and fashion your own life and the lives of your family, according to the Doctrine of Christ, and to make yourself and them, as much as you are able, wholesome examples and patterns to the flock of Christ?

Ordinand: I will, the Lord being my helper.

Bishop: Will you reverently obey your Bishop and other Ministers who, according to the Canons of the Church, may have charge and authority over you, following with a glad mind and a good will their godly admonitions, and submitting yourself to their godly judgments?

Ordinand: I will, the Lord being my helper.

Bishop: Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who has given you a good will to do all these things, grant you also the strength and power to perform them, accomplishing in you the good work which he has begun, that you may be found perfect and without reproach on the last day; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE ORDINATION OF THE DEACON

All now stand as witnesses, except the Ordinand, who kneels facing the Bishop.

Bishop: Let us pray.

O God, most merciful Father, you sent your Son Jesus Christ to take upon himself the form of a servant. He humbled himself, becoming obedient even to death on a Cross. Yet you have highly exalted him, and made him Lord of all. For this great mystery, and for this your servant whom you now call to obedience after his example, we offer you our most hearty thanks; and we ask that we may daily increase in humility and service, that by her ministry as well as by those with whom they serve, your holy Name may forever be glorified, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Bishop lays hands on the Ordinand

Receive the Holy Spirit for the Office and work of a Deacon in the Church of God, now committed to you by the imposition of my hands; in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Bishop: In your great goodness, O Lord, make this your servant Deacon in your Church; give her grace to be modest, humble, and constant in her ministry; give her a ready will to observe all spiritual discipline; and with the testimony of a good conscience always before her, may she continue stable and strong in the service of your Son Jesus Christ, to whom be glory and honor, world without end.

The People in a loud voice respond

All: Amen.

The new Deacon is now vested according to the Order of Deacons. Then the Bishop delivers a Book of Gospels or New Testament saying

Bishop: Take the authority to read the Gospel in the Church of God and to teach the same.

CONFIRMATION & REAFFIRMATIONS

Bishop: The Candidates for Confirmation and Reaffirmation will now be presented.

Presenters: Brian, Bishop in the Church of God, We present Karen Bailey, Connie Blair, Tabitha Drake, and John Mark Howard for Confirmation. We present David and Mary Lambie for Reaffirmation.

Bishop: Have they been adequately prepared?

Presenters: They have.

Bishop: Dearly beloved, it is essential that those who wish to be Confirmed in this Church publicly confess Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior; become his disciples; know and affirm the Nicene Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Ten Commandments; and have received instruction in the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments and the Catechism of the Church. God's grace is imparted in Baptism, through which we are made God's children by adoption and given the Holy Spirit. By the power of the Spirit, manifested in gifts and fruit, we are enabled to be God's people for the sake of the world.

Now, these Candidates desire publicly to confess their faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and their commitment to follow him as Lord. They also desire the strengthening of grace through the laying on of hands, that the Holy Spirit may fill them more and more for their ministry in the Church and in the world.

Bishop: Do you, here in the presence of God and the Church, renew the solemn promises and vows made at your Baptism and commit to keep them?

Candidates: I do.

Bishop: Do you renounce the devil and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Candidates: I renounce them.

Bishop: Do you renounce the empty promises and deadly deceits of this world that corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Candidates: I renounce them.

Bishop: Do you renounce the sinful desires of the flesh that draw you from the love of God?

Candidates: I renounce them.

Bishop: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and confess him as your Lord and Savior?

Candidates: I do.

Bishop: Do you joyfully receive the Christian Faith, as revealed in the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments?

Candidates: I do.

Bishop: Will you obediently keep God's holy will and commandments, and walk in them all the days of your life?

Candidates: I will, the Lord being my helper.

Bishop: Let us pray.

Almighty and everliving God, we beseech you to strengthen these your servants for witness and ministry through the power of your Holy Spirit. Daily increase in them your manifold virtues of grace: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and true godliness, and the spirit of holy fear, now and forever. Amen.

PRAYER AND THE LAYING ON OF HANDS

Each confirmand kneels in front of the Bishop, who prays for each one in these or similar words:

Bishop: Strengthen, O Lord, with your Holy Spirit, your servant; empower him/her for your service; and sustain him/her all the days of his/her life.

All: Amen.

FOR REAFFIRMATION

Bishop: Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

All: We will.

Bishop: N., the Holy Spirit, who has begun a good work in you, direct and empower you by his grace, that you may continue in the service of our Lord Jesus Christ all the days of your life.

All: Amen.

Bishop: I sign you with the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Bishop: Almighty and everliving God, let your fatherly hand ever be upon these your servants; let your Holy Spirit ever be with them; and so lead them in the knowledge and obedience of your Holy Word, that they may faithfully serve you in this life, and joyfully dwell with you in the life to come; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

THE PEACE

Celebrant: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All: And also with you.

At this time, parents should pick up their children from the nursery and children's worship.

THE HOLY COMMUNION

Please be seated.

Celebrant: Let us with gladness present the offerings of our life and labor to the Lord.


